<u>Call for Paper for a Special Issue on "Sustainable Coastal Social-ecological Systems"-</u> <u>International Journal of Sustainable Development and World Ecology</u>

International Journal of Sustainable Development & World Ecology (IF 2.37), has agreed to publish a special issue on sustainable coastal social-ecological systems. All manuscript submissions are subject to initial appraisal by the Guest Editors and if found suitable for further consideration, to peer review by independent, anonymous expert referees.

Justification:

Understanding human-nature interactions is vital for implementing development practices that optimize human well-being and sustain resource utilization. Coastal systems comprising both social and ecological elements of interconnected reliance across multiple scales can be conceptualized as complex socio-ecological systems (SES). Approximately 40% of global population lives within 100 km of the shore, and global change is rapidly shifting boundary conditions of both human and ecological domains within these coastal SES. The objective of this special issue is to advance understanding of the sustainability of human-nature interactions within coastal settings through theoretical SES approaches and related analytical methods.

Scope and Potential Topics:

We invite original research article, reviews, short research and short communication paper including, but not limited to, the following themes:

- Quantitative and qualitative approaches for assessing sustainability of coastal systems by using SES approaches, such as system dynamics modelling, network analysis, agent based modelling, participatory and/or mixed methods
- Operationalizing SES approaches for management and governance of coastal resources in the context of sustainable development of coastal SES.
- Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in the context of coastal SES
- Social-ecological system archetypes and co-evolution for coastal SES management
- Qualitative methods, including case studies, ethnographic and/or grounded theoretical approaches for examining coastal systems;
- Integrated frameworks for coupling social, institutional, and natural systems in coastal systems analyses;
- Environmental justice/telecoupling/equity for ensuring the sustainability of coastal SES.
