Doctoral Agreement

The Doctoral Agreement must be completed at the latest six months after starting your PhD. In order to offer the best possible support to doctoral students, the Doctoral Agreement defines the framework conditions of the doctorate (form and duration of the doctorate, educational, research and supervision goals) as well as the aspired academic accomplishments (written contributions and conference contributions). The educational and research objectives of the doctoral student shall be specified one year at a time, reviewed annually and readjusted:
